Welcome

We're glad you're here! Thank you for joining us today. Members of this congregation have been gathering here to worship since 1804, when our church was formed to minister to the Native American and European settlers in Athens. Over the past two centuries our congregation has changed, but our mission remains the same: to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We are inspired by the words of John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, who encouraged believers to "do all the good you can, in all the ways you can." At Athens First United Methodist, there are many ways to get involved, grow in your faith, and do good in our community.

If you are unable to attend worship in person, each Sunday our 11:00 a.m. service is broadcast on WRFC 960 AM, and our 9:45 and 11:00 a.m. services are live-streamed on our website at athensfirstumc.org/webcast.

Nursery

Worship activity bags (age appropriate for all preschool and elementary children) are available every Sunday in the narthex and by the south entrance of the sanctuary. Children's Church is held for children in kindergarten through second grade and follows the Children's Message during 11:00 a.m. worship all Sundays except for Communion Sundays.

Beyond brokenness there is forgiveness incomprehensible,

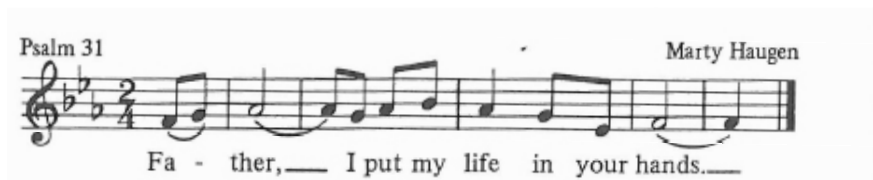
Beyond betrayal there is grace poured out eternally.

Musical Interpretation of the Passion of Christ

This interpretation begins with the familiar tune Land of Rest. The hymn most often sung to this old folk melody is "Lord, Who Throughout These Forty Days", found on page 269 of your hymnal. It is a symbol of our journey through Lent and Christ's time on earth in human form. We move from this hymn to another tune: "When Jesus Wept." This old hymn was written by American composer William Billings in 1770, and portrays Christ's night in the garden of Gethsemane. The words are as follows: When Jesus wept, the falling tear in mercy flowed beyond all bound; when Jesus groaned, a trembling fear seized all the guilty world around.

This poignant melody leads us into a dramatic section of the Sacred Cantata, "The Seven Last Words of Christ," composed by Theodore Dubois in 1867. The organ swells up and down, illustrating the words found in the scripture: "...and the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom." Mark 15:38 (King James)

After the crashing and chaos, we move into Samuel Barber's "Adagio for Strings." This piece of 20th century music became well-known when it was played constantly over the radio in the days following the assassination of President Kennedy. The haunting chords barely cover the slowing heartbeat of the dying Christ. Finally, the music fades completely, and we are left with the reality of the last heartbeat and the earthly death of our Lord and Savior.

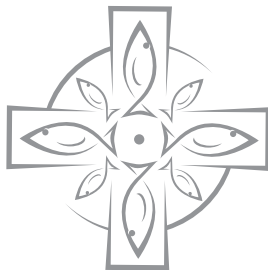
Desserts for REACH International Friday Nights
