They are also working on their Pets badge by learning to care for animals and taking more responsibility for their own pets. Our 8 Junior scouts are currently completing their "Get Moving" journey by exploring the world of energy, its cycles, and conservation. In December, the girls attended a retreat at Camp Martha Johnson, where they began work on their Bronze Award, the highest honor for Junior Girl Scouts. The Cadettes have explored cuisines from other countries, received first aid references and help from a pediatric nurse, and have just finished studying good sportsmanlike conduct.

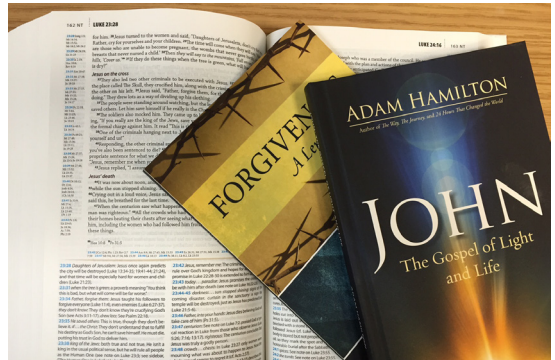


Kids Music and Arts Parent Night
